University of California Undergraduate Experiences Survey (UCUES):

The UCUES solicits students' opinions on their undergraduate academic and co-curricular experiences at UCSD. The survey is conducted every other year (even years) and examines:

- Academic and Personal Development
- Academic Engagement
- Campus Climate For Diversity
- Overall Satisfaction and Agreement
- Plans and Aspirations
- Time Allocation
- Background & Personal Characteristics
- Academic Experience & Globalization
- Community And Civic Engagement
- Student Life And Development

Associated Topics by **Learning Domain**:

Healthy Lifestyle – perceived levels of stress and anxiety, hours of sleep per night

Communicate Effectively – self ratings of oral and written communication

Lead in a Diverse Society – participation in student government, clubs, and organizations both as a participant and leader

CIRP Freshman Survey:

The CIRP Freshman Survey collects important information on what incoming freshman are like before they experience college. The survey is conducted annually and examines:

- Demographics
- College Admissions Decisions
- Financing College
- High School Experience and Behaviors
- Knowledge, Skills and Abilities
- Expectations for College - Majors and Careers
- Expectations for College Life

The Your First College Year Survey (YFCY) offers a window into the first-year experience. YFCY provides comparability and comprehensive understanding of first year students' academic and personal development. The survey is conducted annually and examines:

- Adjustments to College
- Academic Outcomes and Experiences
- Co-curricular Experiences
- Satisfaction
- Overall Growth

[Graduating Senior Survey\(CSS\):](#)

Also known as the College Senior Survey (CSS), this survey measures the academic and co-curricular experiences of graduating seniors. CSS can be used as an instrument that marks the development of UCSD undergraduates when compared with the UCUES. This comparability displays the effects of UCSD and college experiences. The survey examines:

- Demographic
- Engagement and Interaction with Campus Community
- Rating of Campus Services
- Perception of Academic Experiences
- Inter-group Relations and Experiences
- Academic and Social Adjustments
