Week 1 Evaluation Report

Assessment Project Description

For their first all-campus event, Laura and Katy decided to host a reception for all out-of-state students. An e-vite was sent out inviting all 531 new out of state students to the event. This year UC San Diego welcomed a freshmen class with an increased number of out of state and international students. In order to meet the needs of these students populations, Laura and Katy have been creating programs and events specifically designed for their needs. The Out of State Student Reception held Monday, October 1st of Week 1 is such an event.

The following evaluation was completed at the Out-of-State Student Reception. After mingling, meeting students from the same region, doing ice breakers, and eating In-n-Out burger, this evaluation was completed. The purpose of this assessment was to compile a comprehensive review of the Out of State Student Reception.

Although the data and assessment has been completed for the first out of state student reception, we are planning to host another reception in winter or spring quarter to follow up on these learning outcomes and gauge student growth.

Each attendee was given a paper assessment at the beginning of the event and asked to return it to the hosts when leaving the event.

To ensure student participation, each respondent was given a small gift after turning in their assessment.

Data Analysis Methods

After receiving the surveys, the information was entered into an excel document to be compiled and analyzed.

Responses were tabulated and reviewed to ensure accurate reporting.

Presentation of Findings

After compiling the data and creating the evaluation report, the results of this survey were presented to our divisional supervisors and the Non Resident Student Engagement (NRSE) Committee. The NRSE Committee consists of student affairs officers and department chairs from across the university.

The presentation format was a oral discussion of the student demographics, learning outcomes and statistics associated with the various evaluation questions.

Although no visuals of the data were created in this presentation, in the future, graphs and infographics will be an effective way to communicate the success of our programs.

Summary of Findings

Overall, out of state students were able to meet and connect with other out of state students. More can be done from the administration side to meet the students and help connect them to resources on campus.

Overall, 62.5% of respondents were able to identify at least one staff member.

Identify one student that you got to know better as a result of this event.

92.5% of respondents were able to identify the name of at least one student.

Was there adequate time to meet other students?

87.5% of respondents felt there was adequate time.

Were you able to connect with other out of state students?

100% of respondents felt they were able to connect with other out of state students.

Would you be interested in attending another event similar to this one?

67.5% of respondents answered yes to this question. Unfortunately, 30% did not mark a response. This means that only 1 student or 2.5% responded no.

Future surveys are needed to fully assess the learning outcomes and gauge student development beyond the first week of classes.

Impact of Assessment

This assessment shows that some aspects of the program were extremely effective and there are areas for growth. The assessment also proved the need to identify, connect, and create valuable programs for out of state students.

Lessons Learned

The assessment was successful in addressing some of the learning outcomes for the event. We learned that the questions on your evaluation should directly correlate with your learning outcomes. Once the learning outcomes and the evaluation are aligned assessing the program becomes much easier.

The assessment process was smooth and started with creating learning outcomes to guide the direction of the event. We also collected the evaluations at the event, which proved to be useful in obtaining a high response rate.
