SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

With the 2020 Presidential Election having the potential to be a significant source of stress for students, faculty can assist students through referrals to the following resources providing supportive communities of care:

- <u>Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS)</u> CAPS provides individual counseling, drop in workshops, open forums, and post-election community space
- <u>Campus Community Centers</u> Provides safe spaces for students to gather in community, share their experiences, and gain support from others
- <u>CARE AT SARC</u> Provides a confidential, safe space for survivors of violence or abuse coping with election-related stress and trauma.
- <u>International Students & Programs Office</u> Provides resources and support for the UC San Diego international student community
- Office for the Prevention of Harassment & Discrimination Assists with the prevention and resolution of incidents of bias, harassment and discrimination

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

- <u>Undergraduate Colleges</u> Provides programs, support services, academic support and referrals to campus resources through the student's specific undergraduate college.
- <u>Graduate Division</u> Provides programs, support services, academic support, and referrals to campus resources to graduate students.
